As our economy continues to contract, post secondary tuition rates continue to increase, making college less likely for so many. Nationwide, most public colleges are expected to raise fees between 4% and 9% for the coming year, whereas locally, the University of Arizona has proposed a 13.1% tuition hike for Arizona undergraduates.

President Obama's recent campaign clearly illustrated that large donations are not what defines the success of a campaign as 47% of money raised came from individuals who donated \$200 or less, with the national average contribution being only \$86. **Our campaign success will be similarly defined with our primary goal of getting as many people involved as possible.
